Jubilee grant 2024!

To celebrate the 120th anniversary of the Swedish Heart-Lung foundation 2024, the foundation will announce a jubilee grant. The jubilee grant is intended for researchers who obtained their Ph.D. seven to 15 years ago (main applicants) and have not yet achieved a full professorship.

The grant is awarded to collaborative projects involving mid-career researchers. The collaborative project must include both a clinical researcher and a translational researcher. National collaboration is encouraged.

The ambition is to grant at least 4 projects to at least 4 different medical universities. However, since the primary criteria for evaluation are the quality and innovation of the projects, it may result in fewer than 4 different medical universities being selected.

Each approved grant consists of 5 million Swedish kronor over a three-year period and can be allocated between a minimum of 1 million and maximum of 2 million kronor per year. The applicants are assessed by a specially appointed international evaluation group.

Conditions

- The grant is targeted at researchers who have not obtained a professorship.
- Eligible applicants include researchers who obtained their Ph D 7-15 years ago (main applicant) and researchers who obtained their Ph D up to 20 years ago (co-applicant). It is therefore not possible to benefit more years due to for example clinical training, parental leave, or sick leave
- When evaluating the research program, particular emphasis is placed on originality and the likely clinical significance. The forms of collaboration between the translational and clinical researcher, and how this strengthens the quality of the project, should be described clearly, and will be assessed in the evaluation.
- The application should also include support letters from the university (head of department) and the region (head of clinical department or equivalent), indicating that resources and time for the applicant will be allocated to facilitate the project.
